Annexure -1 7.1 Innovations introduced during the academic year 2019-20.

- Finishing school programme the education department Government of Gujarat has taken the initiative to introduce finishing school concept for the student of the colleges. This initiative has been implemented by KCG. The objective of the programme is to enhance the employability skills of the students who are academically good but lack in communication and life skills, due to which they are unable to secure jobs. The overall focus of these programmes was to develop interpersonal skills of the students and their proficiency in English language and speaking. In order to touch them interview skills, public speaking, soft skills, life skills, use of right words at right place, resume writing and group discussion.
- College has given opportunity to all student teachers by conducting FINISHING SCHOOL Programme of LIFE SKILLS worth 20 hours for each.
- Expert is invited for the training of Self Defence for the student teachers during semester.
- Kanuni Seva from the panel of Judges are invited for the discussion session to student teachers with sister concern college.

• Annexure -1 7.2 Best practices during the academic year 2019-20.

Activity in language

According to NEP 2019 learning, speaking, reading and writing of the four language (GUJARATI, HINDI, SANSKRIT, ENGLISH) is important and compulsory for all student as well as teachers. To prepare skill based teacher for new MDGs 2020. Indian Institute of Teacher Education University Gandhinagar has initiated compulsory learning of acquiring LSRW in all four languages mentioned.

In semester 1 enrolment there are approximate 20 students are enrolled with pure Language subjects and all has to learn and teach the subject Gujarati compulsory with basic theories and practical also.

To identify and acquire knowledge about Gujarati writer and poet, each student has given instruction to collect the pictures of specific size and draft a note about that poet or writer. Other students are assigned to write about any five idioms, phrases and proverbs related to modern life. Proper guidance, use of dictionaries, use of encyclopaedia, materials and internet facilities are provided by teacher educators. Collections are made

and categorised by ancient and modern poet and writers as prepared literature. Created information's are displayed in library for learning to other students.

Learning and teaching through Collaborative learning practice (Concept Mapping)

Groups are allowed to come in front of the class. Cycle model or chain related pictures or cuttings are given to the students. On the board numbers or arrow are pasted that a group has to paste or put the picture to complete correct sequence or chain or a model according to their concept. It is compulsory to each group for complete the task in time.

Topic Food chain, Maslow need of hierarchy, Mathematics theorem, TPCK model, Mind control techniques, process of observations and SWOT analysis are taught through these techniques by associate professor Kamalnayan Parmar. The work is assigned to student teachers for making the learning better and develop psychology towards teaching learning process.
