Annexure-1 (7.1 Innovations introduced during this academic year)

The aim of the institute is not only obtaining knowledge but also character building. The motto of the institute is "Character is Life" given by the Swami Krupalu. On 15th of june, 1971 Shri Ratanshi Purushottam Anada Shikshan mahavidhyalay was started with the blessings of swami shri krupalu maharaj. At the time of inaugurating college and its central hall Swamiji wrote the message "CHARACTER IS LIFE". Since then it has been the ideal of this institute and we try our level best to achieve this motto. The spiritual talk helps student in building good virtues and values in life. The knowledge contribution of people of worldwide by inventions and service for well being and humanity leads student teachers to inculcate values. In all the activities held by the institute leads to humanity, harmony and peace.

Today when there is an atmosphere of keen competition of 'marks oriented society' schedule of quiz helps student teacher gain general knowledge which is helpful in competitive exams. Quiz is one of the activities during prayer assembly where a trainee whose turn is to ask quiz prepares 10 to 12 MCQ and asks in the assembly. All the trainees not only get information about general knowledge but also learn to prepare multiple choice type questions. While teaching blue print we explain them all three types of questions. We conduct a small group seminars of discussion method, supervised guided and directed by in charge professor. Where the students understand the concept of teaching point assignments are given. In assignment student teacher writes the answer of the given questions. The mode of the questions remains on base on structure of annual examination. Trainees learn and prepare objective types of questions and write their answers in assignment writing, planning the block teaching unit exam and during lessons of micro teaching like questioning skill and introduction skills.

Spot examination and examination without supervision is also innovative activities of institution. We sometimes conduct spot examination and spot elocution on given topic to evaluate the readiness and thinking ability of students. Atmosphere also becomes helpful to the student teachers because they are preparing to be ready at any time and place for the task. We conduct the unit tests without supervisor. We motivate students for self evaluation by saying that no supervisor would be in the class but be the supervisor of

yourself as you are the teachers of tomorrow. We are trying to prepare student teachers as a good self assessor. We monitor the whole exam by CCTV frequently.
